

Worth noting:

In all three districts...

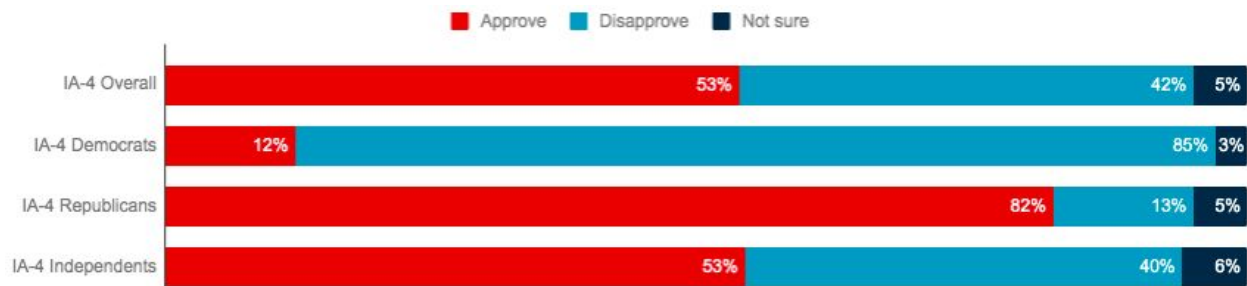
- At least 76% of voters, including Democrats, Republicans, and Independents, support allowing Medicare to negotiate lower drug prices.
- At least 73% of voters, including Democrats, Republicans, and Independents, support allowing generic competition on life-saving drugs.
- At least 84% of voters, including Democrats, Republicans, and Independents, say drug prices are an important issue.
- At least 53% of voters, including Democrats, Republicans, and Independents, say they would be more likely to support a candidate who stands up to Big Pharma.
- At least 48% of overall voters support a public option for prescription drugs (a publicly-owned, not-for-profit drug company).

Detailed results:

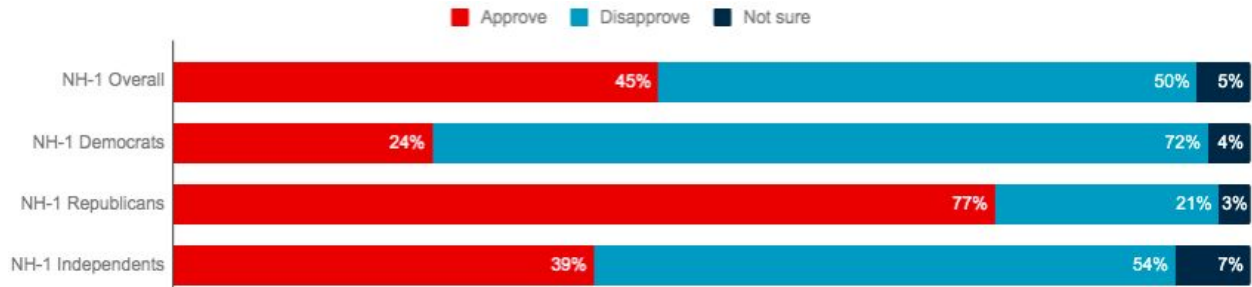
Methodology: The polls were conducted by Public Policy Polling. 1000 voters were polled in IA-4, including 301 Democratic caucus-goers. The margin of error for the overall sample in IA-4 is +/- 3.1% and the margin of error for the Democratic caucus voter sample there is +/- 5.6%. 684 voters were polled in NH-1, including 353 Democratic primary voters. The margin of error for the overall sample in NH-1 is +/- 3.8% and the margin of error for the Democratic primary voter sample there is +/- 5.2%. 1004 voters were polled in SC-1, including 430 Democratic primary voters. The margin of error for the overall sample in SC-1 is +/- 3.1% and the margin of error for the Democratic primary voter sample there is +/- 4.7%. These polls were conducted by telephone.

Q: Do you approve or disapprove of President Donald Trump's job performance?

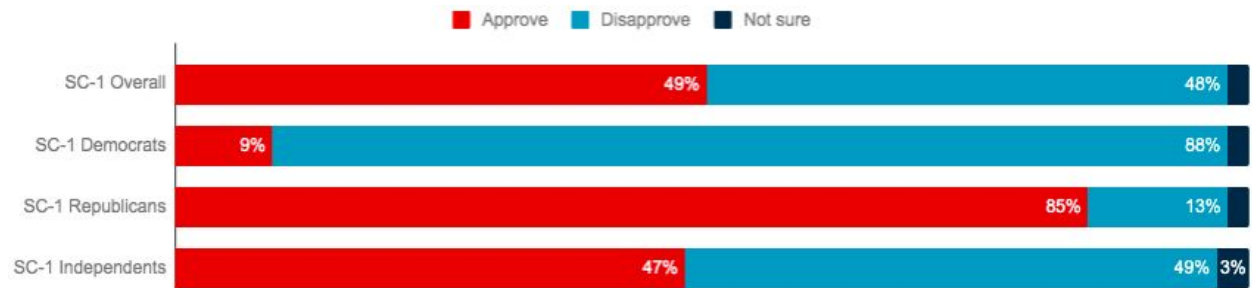
IA-4: (Iowa's most Republican congressional district, where Democrat J.D. Scholten came 3.3% from defeating Steve King in 2018.)



NH-1: (A perennial swing district that Trump won in 2016, and will be key to hold in order to maintain the House majority.)

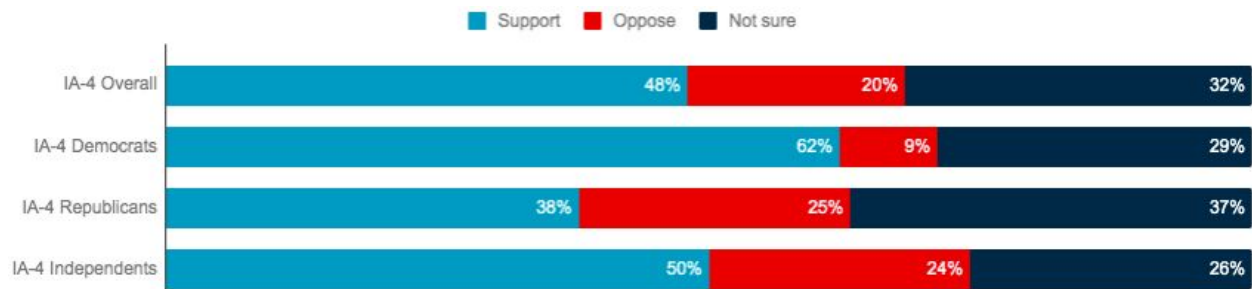

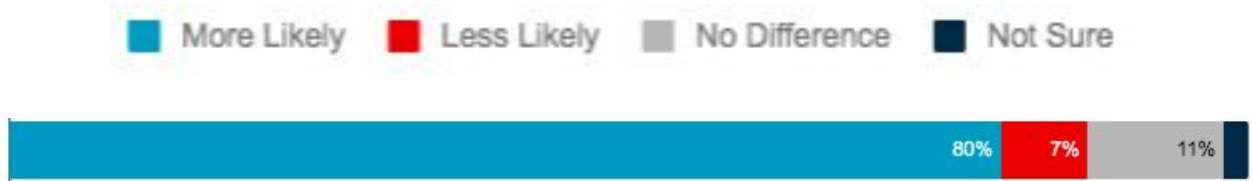


Q: Would you be more or less likely to support a candidate who stands up to Pharma, the lobbying group for the big drug companies, or would it not make a difference?

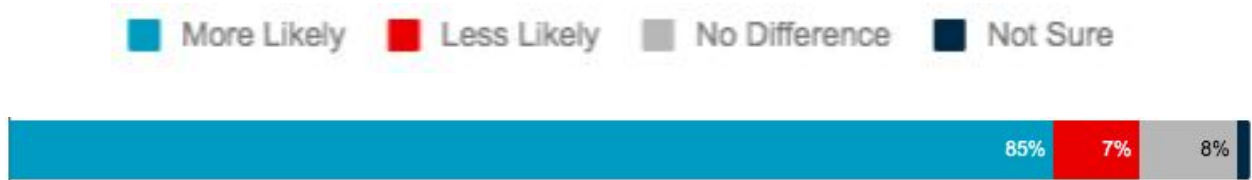
